WHAT IS TRANSITION YEAR?

Transition year is a one year programme designed to act as a bridge to help pupils make the transition from Junior to Senior Cycle.

THE TRANSITION YEAR PROGRAMME

The overall mission of TY is "To promote the personal, social, educational and vocational development of pupils and to prepare them for their role as autonomous, participative and responsible members of society".



Transition Year History

Introduced in 1973.

Currently over 550 schools offer the programme.

Approximately 40,000 students

Compulsory in one third of schools.




BENEFITS OF TRANSITION YEAR


Mathematics: (3 classes per week)

CORE SUBJECTS

Irish: (3 classes per week)

NB: Oral worth 40% in the L Cert

Emphasis on

- Oral & aural work

Students are encouraged to set up and operate a voluntary/commercial enterprise and compete in the *Young Enterprise Scheme* Competition .


Engineering / Electronics

Mini Sumo Robot Wrestling

• The students will design, make and program an AUTONOMOUS ROBOT to compete in competitions

COURSE STRUCTURE:

- Introduction to Robot Sumo.
- Assemble a motor controller circuit board.
- Make and assemble a robot.
- Install various sensors.
- Program the robots
- Fight other robots by pushing the opponent out of the ring like traditional SUMO.






All 3rd Year Students are eligible.

Students must complete & submit an Application Form

 Someone who is still unsure of what they want to do in the future and wants time to decide.

 Someone who is positive and interested and who wants to gain additional skills.

 Someone who wants to become more confident, mature and independent.

 Someone who is willing to get involved in group activities and project work.
